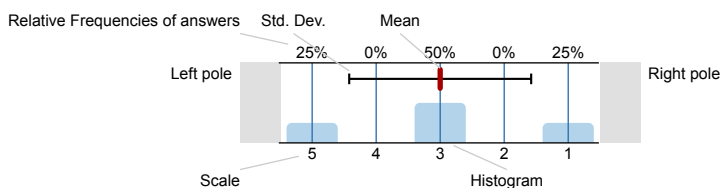

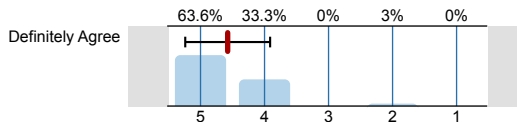

- Only 1 class + 1 office hour a week is too little especially leading up to exams or summatives

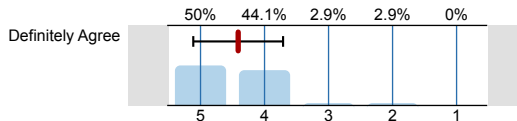

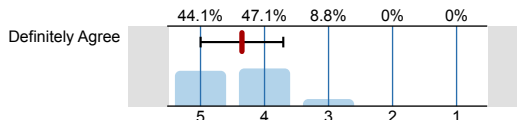

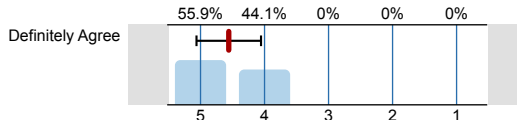

- Lecturer is much improved from the lecturer last year -- I can't stress this point enough. Consequently, the material learnt this year was much more engaging and thought provoking.

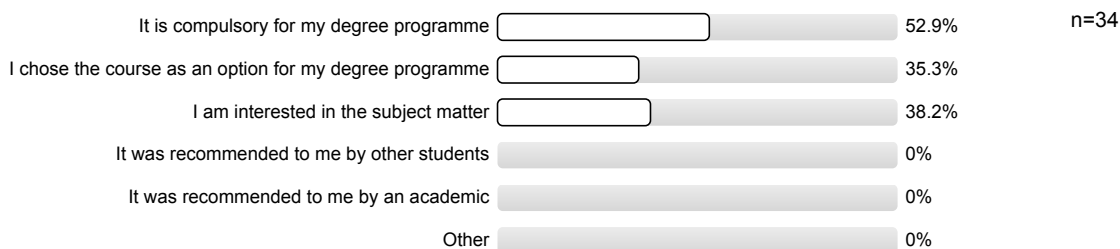
- The readings are useful. The structure of the course is very clear week-on-week and seems to be fairly comprehensive of African history.

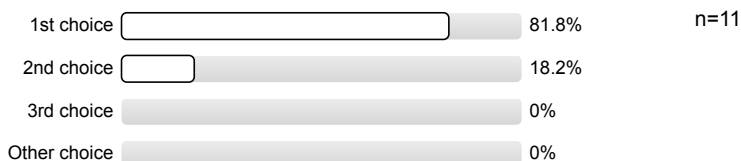
- I think more weighting of our overall grade should be given to the summative essay. It does not make sense that a 3000-word essay is worth less than a 1500 word essay in the exam.
